Home Run Script has only Oldstyle Figures, though Home Run Sanscript has both Oldstyle & lining: 1234567890 1234567890

When the capitals of Home Run Sanscript are used for a word or a group of words, I like to reduce their point size so that they don't OVERPOWER the lowercase. I also increase the tracking a bit. ABCDEFGHIJKLMNOPQRSTUVWXY&Z The font contains only a few alternate characters: fl J r * ? @

NOTE: The @ in bold fonts require special treatment. The outline tends to clog, so I've reversed the shape so that it reads in small sizes. The interrabang? designed by Richard Isbell for his 1967 ATF Americana font is useful for phrases both interrogative and exclamatory. "Howabout that?"
