

GOUDY TRAJAN

Goudy Trajan, a CastleType original, is my interpretation of the drawings of American type designer Frederic W. Goudy (1865–1947), which are one of the best renderings of the inscriptional letters on the famous Trajan column in Rome. In 1930, Goudy created a metal type called "Trajan" based on his drawings, but a great deal of subtlety was lost in translation. One of the most elegant typefaces in the CastleType library, Goudy Trajan retains that original subtlety. Available in three weights: Regular, Medium, and Bold. All weights support most European languages; only Regular supports Cyrillic at this time.
