

MFC Pantomime Monogram Guidebook

The inspiration source for Pantomime Monogram is an unusual Art Deco design from a vintage embroidery publication which combines sans-serif and flare serif styles to create a diamond framework. This monogram which evokes visions of it etched into bakelite was originally intended to adorn handkerchiefs, but it has so many other possibilities. This is one of many monogram designs from the early 1900's which fall into a two letter format that is either adorned or interwoven with framing styles.

Pantomime Monogram Standard Styles

Pantomime Monogram is only capable of two letter monograms due to its unique design. For those with Opentype Ligatures enabled, Pantomime Monogram will automatically type the monogram correctly no matter what combination of Capitals and Lowercase you type.

To create a deco inspired monogram, select MFC Pantomime Monogram from your font menu, and just type a Capital, then a lowercase letter.



Type A then e



Type H then k



Type M then s

If you want to add a little style to this straightforward monogram, try playing with tonal or contrasting colors. Set one color for the Capital letter, and a different color for the lowercase letter. (see the examples below)



Type K then p



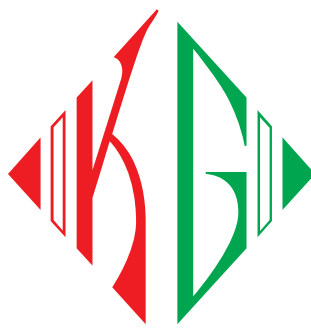
Type E then f



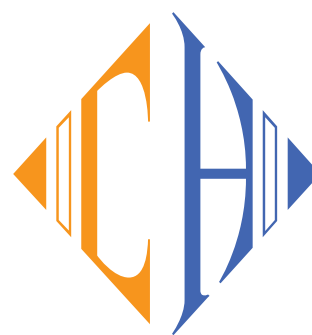
Type S then b
