Aeronaut™ bicolor guidance

With Aeronaut you can easily design two-colored headlines in three steps.


Please note: you will want to be working in an application that offers layering options. Such applications would be Adobe Photoshop, Indesign and Illustrator, CorelDRAW, or Quark, for example.

1. choose „Aeronaut-Base“ for your two-colored headline

2. duplicate the text-layer and choose „Aeronaut-Parachute“ or „Aeronaut Balloon“

3. place one layer congruently above the other. Done!
